BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared the undersigned affiant who, after being duly sworn by me, on oath stated: My name is Eddie Lopez, #7021 and I am a peace officer of the City of Dallas, Dallas County, Texas. I, the affiant, have good reason and do believe that on or about the 15th day of April, 2014, one (name of suspect) Dagoberto Castanon I/m/10-7-88 did then and there in the City of Dallas, Dallas County, Texas commit the offense of Murder, a violation of Section 19.02 of the TEXAS PENAL CODE, a FELONY I

Colleen Shinn # 5772, a fellow peace officer of the City of Dallas, Dallas County, Texas, who personally participated in the investigation of this alleged offense, providing information to Affiant, and whose information Affiant believes to be credible.

On April 15, 2014, at approximately 8:00 AM Suspects Dagoberto Castanon I/m/10-7-1988 and Rogelio Avila I/m/04-14-1990 committed the offense of Murder 19.02, against complainant Ethan Vasquez I/m/01-15-2001 at the intersection of 5100 Monticello Avenue and the 3200 Homer Street, in Dallas, Dallas County Texas.

The facts of the offense are as follows: Suspect Dagoberto Castanon and Rogelio Avila were in Highland Park, Texas, in a stolen navy blue Chrysler mini van with stolen plates [REDACTED], when they ran a stop sign. A Highland Park police officer, driving a marked police vehicle, observed the traffic violation and attempted to pull over the mini van with use of lights and siren. The mini van fled at a high rate of speed, evading the officer's attempts to pull it over. The officer followed the suspect vehicle into the city limits of Dallas, Texas, where the officer lost sight of the vehicle and stopped the pursuit. As the officer was searching for the mini van, he turned onto Homer Street, he observed a multi vehicle collision that had just occurred several blocks down and proceeded to assist. Complainant Ethan Vasquez I/m/01-15-2001 was being driven to school by his mother, Sandy Vasquez, in her Nissan Versa license [REDACTED], on Monticello and was crossing the intersection at Homer, when the suspect vehicle ran the stop sign and collided into the Versa and knocked it into a Nissan Xterra license [REDACTED]. The suspects abandoned the vehicle fleeing on foot without rendering aid to anyone who may have been injured. The complainant, Ethan Vasquez, was transported to Baylor Hospital where he was pronounced deceased. The actions of the suspects while operating the stolen vehicle and fleeing caused the death of the complainant. His mother, Sandy Vasquez, suffered serious bodily injury and was transported to Baylor where she underwent surgery. Traffic Detectives, Homicide Detectives, and Crime Scene responded to the scene to investigate. An abandoned phone found in the stolen mini van. The phone belonged to [REDACTED] and a follow-up investigation revealed that Dagoberto Castanon, her boyfriend, was in possession of the phone at the time of the collision.

WHEREFORE, Affiant requests that an arrest warrant be issued for the above accused individual in accordance with the law.

Suspect Castanon became a person of interest. At this point a search warrant was obtained to fully examine the phone. On 4/17/14 [REDACTED] was interviewed and said she had given her old phone to Suspect Castanon. She stated that on Tuesday, the day of the offense, she received a text [REDACTED] from Suspect Castanon telling her not to call his phone because the phone was lost. [REDACTED] stated that when Suspect Castanon arrived home [REDACTED] on the date of the collision, he had cuts to the top of his head, and told her that he was in the stolen vehicle when it crashed and didn't know if the persons in the other vehicle survived. [REDACTED] stated she drove Castanon to a pharmacy for bandages for his injuries received in the collision. He then had her cancel her phone service on the phone that he left in the stolen vehicle. Suspect Castanon directed [REDACTED] to get him a new phone. Castanon asked her to go to Mexico with him but she refused. She drove Suspect Castanon to Rogelio Avila's residence. [REDACTED] knows that Avila and Castanon are partners involved in criminal activity. Castanon stated to [REDACTED] that Avila was with him at the time of the collision. She said she has not heard from Suspect Castanon since the day of the offense. On April 18, 2014, Detective Montenegro, #6991, and Detective Lopez, #7021, showed [REDACTED] a single photo whom she identified as Suspect Avila, a person she has known for approximately two years.

The suspects were in the commission of a felony and in the immediate flight, the suspects committed an act clearly dangerous to human life that caused the death of Complainant Ethan Vasquez 1/m/01-15-2001.

[REDACTED] stated she drove Castanon to a pharmacy for bandages for his injuries received in the collision. He then had her cancel her phone service on the phone that he left in the stolen vehicle. Suspect Castanon directed [REDACTED] to get him a new phone. Castanon asked her to go to Mexico with him but she refused. She drove Suspect Castanon to Rogelio Avila's residence. [REDACTED] knows that Avila and Castanon are partners involved in criminal activity. Castanon stated to [REDACTED] that Avila was with him at the time of the collision. She said she has not heard from Suspect Castanon since the day of the offense. On April 18, 2014, Detective Montenegro, #6991, and Detective Lopez, #7021, showed [REDACTED] a single photo whom she identified as Suspect Avila, a person she has known for approximately two years.

The suspects were in the commission of a felony and in the immediate flight, the suspects committed an act clearly dangerous to human life that caused the death of Complainant Ethan Vasquez I/m/01-15-2001.
