Our lobbying efforts provide Chevron's perspectives on energy and other public policy issues important to the company. We lobby ethically, transparently and in a bipartisan manner, in accordance with all laws and regulations.

We are committed to adhering to the highest standards of ethics and transparency in engaging in any political contributions. We have strict policies and internal approval processes so that decision making and reporting on political contributions comply with the letter and spirit of all applicable laws. Chevron goes above and beyond the legal reporting requirements by listing the corporate and CEPAC political contributions made during the previous year on the [Chevron.com](http://Chevron.com) website. The list includes payments directed to organizations regardless of tax status for election-related activities.

Chevron employees, through the Chevron Employees Political Action Committee (CEPAC), contribute to candidates from both parties for federal office, as well as to state and local candidates in certain U.S. jurisdictions. A list of federal contributions made by CEPAC is also available on the U.S. Federal Election Commission (FEC) web site. Although allowed by federal law, CEPAC does not contribute to Presidential candidates, political parties or leadership PACs.
